





In a democratic democracy all voices are heard every day and all votes are counted on election day. The result of such a democracy is a society of happy losers.



























#### Countries With Declines in Freedom Have Outnumbered Those With Gains for the Past Nine Years







#### Democracy on the rise




- The number of electoral democracies has more than doubled since 1975


#### Would you rate the following models of government as good or bad?


Percentages are global medians based on 38 countries
